

## Librarian's Report

2016 began with the long-anticipated renovation of the basement area into our children's department. The first few months were spent watching the progress as the renovation proceeded and in hours of consultation as we collaborated and melded our various ideas for the space. The colours, feel, division of areas and furniture were discussed, agreement was reached and we proceeded. Our children's librarian, Kathie MacIsaac, met with local artist Joanne Harris to develop a vision for a mural for the space. Joanne's artwork is an integral part of our décor. The move was made on May 30<sup>th</sup> and we were open to the public on June 1. Thanks to all our moving volunteers for their assistance in making this a smooth transition. The official grand opening took place on September 24. Community support for the children's library was outstanding. We thank everyone for their support.

The TD Summer Reading Program ran from June 25 to August 19 and our total registration reached an all-time high of 85 this year, up from 28 in 2015. The program ended with a magic show by Ryan Price which was well attended.

Upstairs, collections were rearranged and expanded into the new space offered when the children's area was moved.

Personnel from Public Library Services visited our library on several occasions and we thank them for their assistance, knowledge and input throughout the year. As someone new to public libraries, I certainly appreciated their support. We were also fortunate to receive a grant through PLS to support the implementation of a new LibPress website through the B.C. Library Cooperative.

Our fall programming included a weekly baby story time and preschool story time. We also held Halloween and Christmas story times.

Fall also began the planning for the new year with our wishes for expanded and streamlined library services integrated within the community. I would like to thank the library board members and my dedicated and supportive staff who make my job so rewarding. – Bonnie Brown

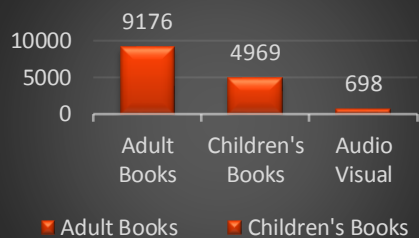
