Librarian's Report

2019 was a growth year for us at Headingley Library. One of our goals was to increase programming and outreach and we have been successful in doing that. For our adult members we continued with our interesting and engaging presentations by four Manitoba authors with Fred Headon in February, Amanda Onchulenko in April and Dr. Frederick Ross in September. The children's department hosted Kevin Sylvester and Richard Scrimger for the grade 4 and 5 classes at Phoenix school in October. They discussed the Epic Squad series, writing, drawing, sports and more. The children's librarian provided a full schedule of preschool programming for babies, tots and preschoolers in 3 sessions throughout the year. She also reads at the local nursery school and hosts the kindergarten day care kids every other week. During the summer, we provided the TD summer program for 106 registered kids as well as various local programs for 126 kids from ages 2-13+ We have also contracted with a dynamic young woman to provide programming for our school age patrons and she has had monthly STEAM programs, ranging from a mad science night to holiday crafts. A very generous grant from the Headingley Foundation allowed us to provide a rotating collection of books to the residents of Heartland Estates, a 55+ building. The library continues to be a drop off site for the annual shoebox project and again this year we collected over 70 boxes plus received a very generous cash donation from the Headingley Fire Department to support this very worthy cause. Our statistics for 2019 surpassed previous years in every area and we are so pleased to see that our efforts to provide reading materials, audio books, movies and magazines are obviously appreciated by our community.
